WHEREAS, all Board Members, having due notice of said meeting, and that pursuant to Article 7, §104 of the Public Officers Law, said meeting was open to the general public and due and proper notice of the time and place whereof was given as required by law; and

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BETHANY, NEW YORK, ADOPTED JULY 8, 2024, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$725,000 TO FINANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE HIGHWAY GARAGE, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$725,000 AND APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT FOR SUCH PURPOSE

The object or purpose for which the bonds are authorized is the construction of improvements to the Highway Garage at the estimated maximum cost of \$725,000.

The maximum amount of obligations authorized to be issued is \$725,000.

The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued is fifteen (15) years; however, the bonds authorized pursuant to this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall mature no later than five (5) years after the date of original issuance of said bonds or notes.

A complete copy of the Bond Resolution summarized above shall be available for public inspection during normal business hours at the office of the Town Clerk, at the Town Hall, 10510 Bethany Center Road, East Bethany, New York.
